This year we've hosted our first ever Venture MAT 'X Games' event! All Year 5/6 children were given a choice of exciting 'extreme' activities to take part in, including, BMX, bouldering, parkour, surfing, tobogganing & skateboarding!

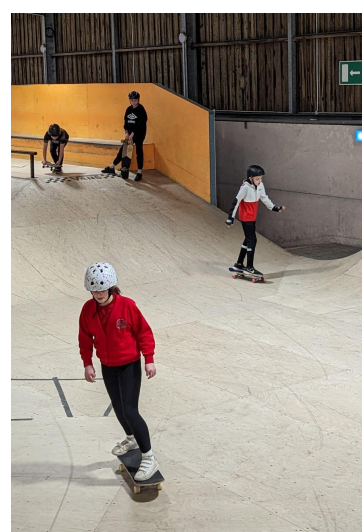
Trevithick and St Issey children took part in the activities which were planned to take place within 1 week at the end of March. Unfortunately, poor weather meant that our bouldering & tobogganing activities were delayed until May. We awarded the most competent, most improved and most courageous person in each activity and every child received a special commemorative medal!



The X Games was an excellent way for us to provide new and alternative opportunities to our upper KS2 children but also an opportunity to create links with local community clubs! We worked with Cornwall BMX, Mount Hawke Skatepark, Global Boarders surf school & West Coast Cheerleading! Dave Davies from Sustrans also came in and ran an indoor scottering challenge!

We know the children enjoyed their respective activities and the event created a lot of enthusiasm around trying new activities. We hope that they may continue to access the respective activities outside of school.

One hundred & twelve Year 5 & 6 children from Trevithick took part in the 'X Games', only 6 children did not participate due to illness, absence and or injury! Across all activities, **196** children participated, with several children being able to take part in more than 1 event, including Year 5/6 children from St Issey school.



EDUCATIONAL TRIPS & VISITS 2022/23

This year we've been able to restart our popular sports trips & visits! In December we visited Sandy park for an Exeter Chiefs Super Saturday experience! The children watched the Chiefs defeat the Stormers in the European Cup as well as take part in a variety of training practices, tackling the bags was a clear favourite! Great fun was had, we even got to walk around the pitch at half time! Thankfully the chiefs beat the Stormers in a close fought game! We got to see many international players like Stuart Hogg & Henry Slade!



In February we took 14 Year 6 children to Wolverhampton to watch them play against Liverpool in the Premier League! We also went to the Sir Jack Hayward training facility where we took part in a football session

run by one of their academy coaches. The session was really enjoyable, the children worked on their passing and other skills. Following this, we headed over to Molineux for a stadium tour. The children were able to sit in the dugouts, changing rooms, walk out of the players tunnel and see so many awesome things that aren't usually on show to the public! We stayed at Lilleshall, one of the national Sports centres, the food was excellent and we had a great stay, the next day we walked the beautiful grounds surrounding Lillieshall before heading back to Molineux for matchday! We watched the teams arrive outside before taking out seats inside the stadium . Wolves had a brilliant game and dismantled Liverpool 3-0! We had a great view of Neves making it 3-0 late on, he celebrated in our corner with his teammates.

We ran a Year 3/4 trip to see our local professional rugby team, the Cornish Pirates. We took part in a training session, formed the guard of honour and played on the pitch at half time. Meeting the players & getting autographs after the game was a particular highlight!

In July we attended the Wimbledon tennis championships on Day 5 of the competition. Watching Round 3 action on Court No.1, we saw Brit Cam Norrie as well as top 10 women's seed Sabalenka. We also managed to catch the first set of Svitolina v Henin on Court No.3. We toured the museum, ate strawberries on Henman Hill and took customary photos outside of Centre Court!
