## PESSPA - Physical Education, School Sport, Physical Activity

A summer term review of all things PESSPA at Trevithick Learning Academy.

### Physical Education

All classes have continued their PE curriculum this term. Trolls class (Y3) have been swimming weekly all term. Year 5 & 6 boys took part in the Cornish Pirates coaching program (summer term 1), whilst the girls did rounders. Year 4 undertook a striking and fielding unit, all mainstream year groups spent time preparing for sports day with our athletics scheme of work in summer term 2. Our PE Coordinator has continued Early Years PE with Year 5 sports leaders supporting. Year 5 also continued their curriculum surf lessons through summer term. Our PE Coordinator has met with PE teaching staff one-to-one to discuss curriculum, assessment and risk assessments.

### School Sport

This term we've offered after school clubs for KS1 football with Saints SW, cricket for Years 3/4 and football & tennis for Years 5/6. We beat Weeth school in a netball friendly at the start of term. We finished our Camborne football league, ending the season with a 4-2 away at Troon. We've also attended several football festivals as well as hosting a year 5 & 6 girls football festival where we placed 1st & 4th out of 6 teams, 43 local girls were involved. We took part in a football festival hosted by Trewirgie school at Redruth JFC. We also attended the first ever MAT Football cup at Mounts Bay Academy, combining a TLA & St Issey team. We concluded our MAT 'X Games' event with bouldering & Tobogganing activities.

We have participated in the Cornwall Cricket competitions, winning the area Year 3 & Year 4 events, before attending the respective county finals. The Year 5 event was cancelled due to rain and the Year 6 event unfortunately clashed with our Year 6 camp week. We hosted our summer Trevictus Games event, holding a morning and afternoon session. 96 children participated throughout the day, from 8 different schools, including Cape Cornwall. CSIA provided sports leaders to assist.

Mr Oates took a rugby team to Redruth RFC to participate in the Cornish Pirates festival, the team won 5 out of their 6 matches. Our Year 3 cricket team attended the county finals event at Roche Cricket club, despite the industrial strike action, winning 2 of their 4 matches.

We attended the Wimbledon Tennis Championships on day 5, watching on Court 1 we saw Brit Cam Norries & women's No.2 seed Sabalenka. The trip involved 7 children, 4 of which, attended our after school tennis club.

Our final enrichment sports trip to Somerset CC had to be cancelled due to the weather forecast! We ran our KS1 sports day on Thursday 6th July and our KS2 event on Thursday 13th July. Our Nursery sports day was cancelled due to the weather forecast. Finally, we celebrated our year of school with our annual sports awards morning on Thursday 20th July.

### Physical Activity

We've been working with Dave Davies from Sustrans this term, he has worked with Years 4, 5 & 6 - assessing cycling skills and providing a targeted provision for less experienced year 6 riders ahead of camp. In summer term 2, the focus was on lower KS2 and supporting children to 'ditch the stabilisers'. An after school club was also offered in both terms to selected children, targeting specific children to develop confidence & proficiency. Summer term provided an opportunity for lunchtime play on the school field which increased football opportunities, with Years 3/4 & 5/6 able to play at the same time. Year 4 have been participating in their regular coastal walking program, whilst Year 5 have continued with their curriculum surf lessons throughout the term.
